AFLAC SPECIAL INSURANCE Enrollment for 2016 Calendar

Year: The following special insurance is available to our employees through AFLAC. November 3rd through November 27th, 2015 is the open enrollment period for the 2016 Calendar Year.

- 1. An AFLAC Disability plan (not pre-tax)
- 2. The AFLAC Cancer Protection Plan
- 3. The AFLAC Dental Plan
- 4. The AFLAC Accident Plan
- 5. The AFLAC Hospitalization Plan
- 6. The AFLAC Life Insurance Plan (not pre-tax) Note: These policies roll over each November and need not be renewed on a yearly basis.

FLEXIBLE SPENDING PLAN Enrollment for 2016 Calendar Year:

This plan, offered by WageWorks, gives you the option to use pretax dollars. The enrollment period for the Flexible Spending Plan for the 2016 Calendar Year will be November 3rd through November 27th, 2015.

The Flexible Spending Plan consists of two options: Flexible Spending Plan for Dependent Day Care and Flexible Spending Plan for eligible unreimbursed Medical and Dental expenses. It is important to remember that you will need to complete an Enrollment Form each November to take advantage of this benefit for the following year. There will be 20 payroll deductions during the plan year; deductions will not be made during the months of July and August.

Health Announcement to all BOCES Employees: Cancer Screenings

New York State Legislation was passed allowing public employees release time from work for breast and prostate cancer screenings. The release time is one allowance, not to exceed 4 hours, per fiscal year, July 1st to June 30th.

What to do⊳

- Fill out a Personal Day form (See your supervisor or program secretary for the three-part form)
- Check OTHER for the reason of absence Indicate HEALTH SCREENING

Documentation from your physician, after the screening, is required. The Personal Day form will be forwarded directly to: Norah Merritt, Executive Director of Human Resources.
