Dutchess BOCES Capital Project One Campus ~ Endless Opportunities

As you know, on December 1, 2009, Dutchess BOCES will conduct a countywide referendum asking residents to vote on our proposal for One Campus ~ Endless Opportunities. The proposal is to construct a new 66,500 square foot Alternative High School on the BOCES Salt Point Campus in Poughkeepsie, renovate portions of the existing Career and Technical Institute (CTI) and the Salt Point Center (SPC), and replace failing roofing systems at a total cost of \$29.65 million. If approved by voters, this proposal will:



- · Convert Rent Payments to Ownership Payments
- Enhance Educational Opportunities for All
- · Save School Districts and Taxpayers Money

Voting will take place at thirteen locations throughout Dutchess County on December 1 from 6:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m. You can learn more about the capital project by checking you mailboxes in early November, attending one of public information sessions, and by visiting <u>Dutchess BOCES</u> and clicking on the One Campus ~ Endless Opportunities link. We are working actively to inform county residents of the details of the building proposal and the December 1st referendum.

Aesop is the automated solution for absence management and substitute placement challenges faced by K-12 school districts worldwide. This service provides participating districts with automated substitute calling. Each district supplies the service with lists of teachers, staff and approved substitutes. The system (Aesop) accepts phone calls from employees and places calls electronically to substitutes based on employee request and substitute availability. Teachers and substitutes can also utilize the internet through www.aesoponline.com to create absences and search for jobs. Several reports record teachers' absences and substitute fill rates are available. This program can produce additional reports such as statistics on substitute/employee activity by date(s), integrate with mylearningplan.com and integrate with a number of financial management systems.

Dental Laboratory Technician Program New Adult Education Program

The Dutchess BOCES Adult Education Division at the Manufacturing and Technology Institute (MTI) has rolled out a new adult educational program, which offers training in the design, fabrication and production of dental prosthesis. The Dental Laboratory Technician Program, which has three separate phases, offers a certification from the Dental Laboratory Association of New York (DLANY) in as little as 10 months as well as a more advanced, Zahn certification. Gary Spadaro, Executive Director of DLANY said, "Dutchess BOCES is the first in New York State to offer an anatomy and physiology course which lays the foundation for producing dental prosthetics. This is the only program that offers the DLANY certification in the Hudson Valley."



The Poughkeepsie Journal published an article on August 18 that detailed this program, which assisted us in getting the word out to the community. The Phase 1 class, Anatomy and Physiology, began September 22 with eight students and runs 13 weeks on Tuesday and Thursday evenings. Phase 2 is scheduled to begin the week of January 11, 2010. Entry-level positions can be obtained upon completion of the first two phases with a more advanced course in digital dentistry being offered as Phase 3. Phase 1 Anatomy and Physiology is offered at MTI. Dental lab technicians fulfill dental prescriptions by manufacturing such prosthetics as crowns, bridges and dentures. Employment is available either in the office of dentists or at a laboratory that specifically manufactures these devices.

Roger Risko Receives Award District Governor's Rotarian of the Year



District Governor Jeffrey Keahon presented the District Governor's Rotarian of the Year Award to BETA's Roger Risko at Rotary Club's Annual Conference. The award was presented to Risko for developing Radio Rotary, which has been broadcasting every Friday featuring over 100 guests thus far. Risko also initiated the concept of Elderact, which was voted on to the 2010 Rotary International Legislative Agenda. Risko serves BOCES as

Director of Community Service for the Arlington Rotary Club Board of Directors and facilitates the Student of the Month Program, which provides monthly and annual awards for students at BETA and CTI. The award is engraved with the names of the Rotary programs that Risko has advised and founded.

Stay Healthy - 'Tis the Cold and Flu Season!

Dutchess BOCES has been in contact with The WorkPlace to administer seasonal flu vaccines this year, which we anticipate will take place either late October or early November. The WorkPlace does plan to offer the H1N1 vaccine this year. More information on this vaccine will be forthcoming.

During cold and flu season, the best way to reduce the risk of becoming ill or spreading flu viruses are listed below.



- **Monitor your health:** Be aware of the flu-like signs and symptoms (fever, cough, sore throat, body aches, headache, chills and fatigue.) Contact your health care provider if necessary.
- **Practice good hygiene:** Cover your nose and mouth with a tissue when you cough or sneeze. Throw the tissue in the trash after you use it. If you don't have a tissue, cough or sneeze into your sleeve or elbow. Avoid touching your eyes, nose or mouth. Germs are spread this way.
- Wash your hands: Wash your hands often with soap and water or an alcohol-based hand sanitizer, especially after you cough or sneeze.
