#### **PEACCE Class at Linden Avenue Middle**

During the month of March, students at Linden Avenue Middle School (LAMS) in Red Hook, including those in the Dutchess BOCES PEACCE class, participated in a climbing unit during

their physical education class. Students were taught the basics of belaying. Belaying refers to a variety of techniques used in climbing to exert friction on a climbing rope so that a falling climber does not fall very far. A climbing partner typically applies the friction at the other end of the rope whenever the climber is not moving, removing the friction from the rope whenever the climber needs more rope in order to be able to continue climbing. Students climbed not only walls, but also challenging elements suspended from the ceiling. During these exercises, students not only need courage, but also focus and determination!
