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CTI Students win at the SkillsUSA State Competition in Syracuse

SYRACUSE, NY – Two students from Dutchess BOCES Career and Technical Institute took two first place finishes in the 49th Annual SkillsUSA State Conference and Skills Championships. The first place contestants are **Wyatt Kelly** (FDR) in the Photography contest and **Deyry Acevedo** (Spackenkill) in the Job Demo (Open) contest. Top students from every part of New York State competed in their respective areas. Thirty-six students from 12 area high schools competed in areas such as culinary arts, cinema production, computer technology, crime scene investigation and other careers that represent the courses offered at CTI.

The competition was held in the New York State Fairgrounds in Syracuse, New York, April 22 through April 24. The scope of the contests included an intense practical hands-on component as well as a written knowledge test.

Both students will represent New York State in the National SkillsUSA Competition this June, to be held in Louisville, KY. CTI's SkillUSA club and competitors will have to raise extra funds to help offset the costs to send these students to Louisville.
